



### Oscar Wilde – a Biography

- 1 Oscar Wilde was born in Dublin in 1854. He studied at Oxford and while he was there, he won a poetry prize. In 1882, his first book of poems was published and in 1884, he got married. Then, in 1888 he wrote a book of stories for his sons, *The Happy Prince and other Tales*. He wrote short stories and many successful plays including *Lady Windermere's Fan* and *The Importance of Being Earnest*. And in 1890, he wrote his only novel *The Picture of Dorian Gray*.

In the story an artist called Basil Hallward paints a portrait of his young and handsome friend, Dorian Gray. When Dorian sees the painting, he falls in love with his own beauty and reflects on how he will grow old, but the portrait will stay forever young. In one bitter moment, Dorian wishes that he could stay young and the portrait could grow old instead of him. His hopes become true, as gradually, Dorian, led by his unprincipled friend Lord Henry Wotton, begins to lead an evil life. With each terrible deed, the picture in the frame grows old and ugly, while Dorian stays young and beautiful.





*Both* means 'one and the other'.

*I've got two sisters. Both of them are teachers.*

*Either* means 'one or the other'.

*'There are two cakes left. Which one would you like?'*

*'I'll have either of them, thanks.'*

*Neither* means 'not one and not the other'.

*'Which T-shirt did you buy: the blue or the red?'*

*'I bought neither of them. The colours didn't suit me.'*
